**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODBURY

1. That the motion adopted by the City Council of the City of Woodbury be and the same is hereby approved, ratified and confirmed insofar as may be necessary under the law to make binding and of full force and effect, all acts, motions, resolutions, appointments, confirmations of appointments, elections to fill vacancy in office, ordinances and proceedings of every nature and description which may come before said City Council at this, its annual meeting, and no act or proceeding passed, adopted or approved at this meeting shall be effected or otherwise impaired by reasons of the fact that the annual meeting of said City Council was held on a day other than January 6, 2025.

**RESOLUTION NO. 25-02**

**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODBURY TO  
PROVIDE RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR PUBLIC PARTICIPATION  
AT CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS**

**WHEREAS**, under the New Jersey Open Public Meetings Act (Act), N.J.S.A. 10:4- 6 et seq., City Council meetings are open to the public with a public portion for comments by the public on governmental issues of concern to the residents; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council encourages members of the public to address the Council in order to permit and encourage public participation at such meetings; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council has determined that the enactment of rules and regulations for the conduct of such meetings and public participation would help clarify the process and encourage the public to participate in City business; and

**WHEREAS**, the Act permits regulations of the amount of time a person may speak in the public portions.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Woodbury that the following rules shall be applied to all public comment portions of the City Council meeting:

- (1) The public is invited to attend and observe all public meetings of the City Council. Persons shall be heard at any public meeting as provided herein.
- (2) At any public meeting for which a member of the public wishes to address the Council, such person may address the Council during those portions of the meeting designated for public participation.
- (3) Those who wish to speak will form a neat line at the podium. Individuals shall not call out from their seat.
- (4) For individuals who are disabled or unable to come to the podium and wish to speak, a microphone will be brought to them.
- (5) After acknowledgment from the Council President, each person to address the Council must state his or her name and residence or business address.
- (6) Members of the public are limited to a five-minute time limit to address the Council during a Public Portion. The time limit may be extended at the discretion of the President of Council with the concurrence of the City Solicitor.

- (7) All questions, comments and dialog must be directed to the Council. The council President or his/her designee will either respond or select another member of council or professional to do so. No intra-audience dialog is permitted during the open session of any meeting.
- (8) Speakers may speak only once during a public portion.
- (9) Speakers on both sides of the dais shall treat each other with courtesy and respect. Individuals should refrain from using foul language.
- (10) At meetings with unusually large attendance, the Council President may impose such additional rules or time limitations as are deemed appropriate from time to time based on business before the Council and the number of persons wishing to speak.
- (11) The Council President or City Solicitor will give one warning of improper behavior. On the next offense, the speaker will be asked to relinquish the floor.

**RESOLUTION NO. 25-04**

**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WOODBURY FIXING  
THE SUM TO BE CHARGED FOR NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETINGS**

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 10:4-19 of the Open Public Meetings Act, permits the public body to fix a reasonable sum to be charged to persons who request that notice of meetings as required under the Act be mailed to them individually; and

**WHEREAS**, said sum is to cover the costs of providing such notice; and

**WHEREAS**, said section further permits the public body to provide such notices free of charge to news media who so request.

1. Each person who requests that individual notice as required under the Act be mailed to him or her shall pay annually or per occasion or request to the City of Woodbury the sum of \$10.00 to cover the costs thereof.

3. The sum herein designated is subject to change upon the adoption of a superseding resolution by the public body.
4. This resolution shall take effect immediately.

**WHEREAS**, these newspapers are designated by this body as the newspapers which have the greatest likelihood of informing the public within the jurisdictional boundaries of the body of such meeting.

**WHEREAS**, N.J.S.A. 40A:2-23 provides for the method by which the interest on assessment installments is calculated; and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Council of the City of Woodbury, the Mayor concurring, that the interest rate of eight (8%) percent per annum be charged on the first \$1,500.00 of the delinquency and eighteen (18%) percent per annum on any amount of delinquency in excess of \$1,500.00 for nonpayment of taxes, assessments and water and sewer billings on or after the date when they shall become delinquent as provided by law. In addition, there shall be a penalty of six (6%) percent on all delinquencies in excess of \$10,000.00 as permitted by N.J.S.A. 54:4-67.

**WHEREAS**, the provisions of Section 40A:4-19 of the Revised Statutes provide for temporary appropriations not in excess of 26.25% of the total appropriations made for all purposes in the budget for the preceding fiscal year excluding, in both instances, appropriations made for interest and debt redemption charges, capital improvement fund and public assistance; and

**WHEREAS**, the temporary appropriations hereinafter made and established are entirely within all limitations imposed by law.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Woodbury as follows:

1. That the sum of **Four Million Six Hundred Eighty-Three Thousand Four Hundred Twenty-Nine and 15/100 Dollars (\$4,683,429.15)** is hereby appropriated to meet and pay the contracts, obligations, commitments and operating expenditures for the Current Fund hereinafter enumerated.
2. The appropriations made hereunder shall be allotted for the following governmental operations in the following sums:

1. That the aforementioned recitals are incorporated herein as though fully set forth at length.

That, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40A:12-7, the Mayor and City Council do hereby authorize the City of Woodbury Planning Board to review the proposed 100 Block South Broad Street Amendment to the Woodbury Redevelopment Plan: Downtown Business District for Block 75, Lots 3.01, 3.02, 4, 5, 7, 13, 14, 15, 17, 31, 32, 33 and 35, Block 75.01, Lots 27.01 and Ross Run and to report its findings to the City Council.
3. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

4. Rental Housing (Chapter 150).
  - A. Registration fee: \$125.00.
  - B. Re-inspection fee: \$50.00.
  - C. Late fee: \$50.00.

**Section 2. Repealer**

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistencies.

**Section 3. Severability**

Each section of this Ordinance is an independent section, and the holding of any section or part thereof to be unconstitutional, void or ineffective, shall not be deemed to affect the validity or constitutionality of any other sections or parts hereof.
